Roger Riewe (Graz, Austria) President

Architect, Prof., RIEGLER RIEWE ARCHITEKTEN

Roger Riewe studied architecture at the RWTH Aachen. After lectureships and visiting professorships in Amsterdam, Prague, Barcelona, Venice, Calgary, Houston, and Graz, Roger Riewe became Professor and Head of the Institute of Architecture Technology at the Graz University of Technology in 2001. He has been and is a member of many boards and councils, for example, the Scientific Committee European. He is author of numerous contributions to journals and publications. Roger Riewe has been a member of the Committee for Competitions and Awards of the Berlin Chamber of Architects and a member of the board of the HDA (House of Architecture) in Graz since 2018.

Roger Riewe is Founding Partner of RIEGLER RIEWE ARCHITEKTEN and operates in a sphere of expertise comprising infrastructural, health service, administration and cultural buildings along with residential buildings and district development concepts.



Saša RANDIĆ (Zagreb, Croatia)

Architect, Prof., RANDIĆ AND ASSOCIATES

Saša Randić graduated from the University of Zagreb, Faculty of Architecture in 1990.

In the following period he joined the Post-graduate Program at the Berlage Institute in Amsterdam, where he got his MA in 1992, being among the Institute's very first generation. From 2003 to 2007 he was President of the Croatian Architects Association, where initiated various researches on transformational processes in the Croatian territory, such as the Congress of Croatian Architects in 2004 and 2007. He was editor-in-chief of the ČIP, the magazine of the Croatian Architects Association from 2008 and in 2009 he initiated pogledaj.to, a blog about architecture and design.

Saša Randić, together with Idis Turato, founded Randić-Turato Architects in 1993 in Rijeka, Croatia, with whom he worked until 2009. In 2009 he founded the architectural office Randić and Associates.

Saša Randić has lectured at Harvard University GSD, ETH Zurich, Berlage Institute Rotterdam, Institute for Advanced Architecture Barcelona, Rotterdam Biennale, TU Munich, and Buenos Aires Biennale. At present he teaches at the Split School of Architecture.

Helle Juul, Architect MAA/MNAL, Ph.D., Founding partner at Juul | Frost Architects in Copenhagen is responsible for numerous major urban strategies and Campus development plans throughout Scandinavia.

The application of research is a recurrent theme in Helle Juul's career, and she has been responsible for several research and development projects, among others the projects "Public Space as a Catalyst for Change" and "The Future Campus: from 'the Academic Village' to 'Urban University Hub'".
